BEYOND THE PALE

FOR LOW FLUTE CHOIR

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B eyond the Pale was commissioned by Judy Diez d'Aux to be performed by members of the National Flute Association Low Flutes Committee at the 2023 National Flute Association Convention in Phoenix, Arizona.

The theme of the 2023 National Flute Association Convention is "Beyond Borders". This piece's title *Beyond the Pale* plays with the idea of going outside the borders of acceptable behavior and judgement to widen the range of timbre typical of the low flutes by using extended techniques such as beatboxing, pizzicato, and key clicks. Low flutes can do more than play low and slow with a lumbaring personality. They can play with excitement and have a variety of characteristics, if just given the opportunity.

EXTENDED TECHNIQUES:

Boo, Ch, & Ts - In a "beat boxing" style, use these syllables as articulation for the pitch indicated in the notation. This will not produce a full tone, but more of a breathy percussive effect.

Pizzicato - Finger the pitch indicated by the notation. Use a hard "Do" or "Tu" articulation to produce a percussive effect similar to what you may hear strings produce when plucking strings.

Key click - While keeping the flute on your face, do not blow into your flute, put slap the keys down hard creating a tapping effect.

norm. - Return to "normal" or "traditional" flute playing.



- Bend pitch down or up (in direction of the arrow) a quarter tone by playing flat or bending the pitch by rolling in headjoint.
